








#### Dr. Ron Canos, NBCT

#### **Parent Involvement & Learning Continues**

- Parents become learning coaches of their children and working with them to ensure assignments and coursework are completed on a timely manner.
- Parents provide direct support and encouragement for their children --become partners in education.
- For current situation --- Learning continues and students learn to take control of their learning.





"Too involved" parents may take away from the learning experience











#### **Time Management**

- When teacher scaffolding and school support such as providing teacher reminders, routines, and staff check-ins, students become successful time managers.
- Providing support removes physical and emotional complexities such as fear, anxiety, loneliness and depression. Students need to be guided on how to become successful time managers.
- Time Management, when learned at an early age, is a skill that contribute to student success.

#### **Time Management**

#### **Younger Learners (K-2)**

- > Create a Picture Schedule/Calendar
- > Practice Waiting and **Anticipation of Events**
- > Use a visual timer
- Be organized there should be a place for everything
- > Be clear about consequences









Younger learners will need constant reminders and guidance.















#### **Flexibility**

- Distance Education allows for:
  - > Self-Pacing
    - Schedules have become more fluid which allows students more choice over WHEN and HOW they do their school work.
    - Students are given a chance to exercise and take breaks.
    - Students are taught to balance school and extracurricular activities.





Younger learners may need more structure and guidance. Flexibility is a skill that they will gradually develop.











#### **Soft Skills are Strengthened**

- What are Soft Skills?
  - > Soft Skills are non-technical skills that include how students interact with their peers, how they solve problems, and how they manage their time to work.

#### **Introverted Students Join in Discussions**

- Schools are really designed for extroverts and usually need lots of stimulation.
- Students who are natural introverts feel their are most "alive" and more productive when they are in quieter, more low-key environments.
- Since much of the classroom and teacher interactions take place online, the quieter students are on equal footing with their more outspoken classmates and can participate more easily in discussions.



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


